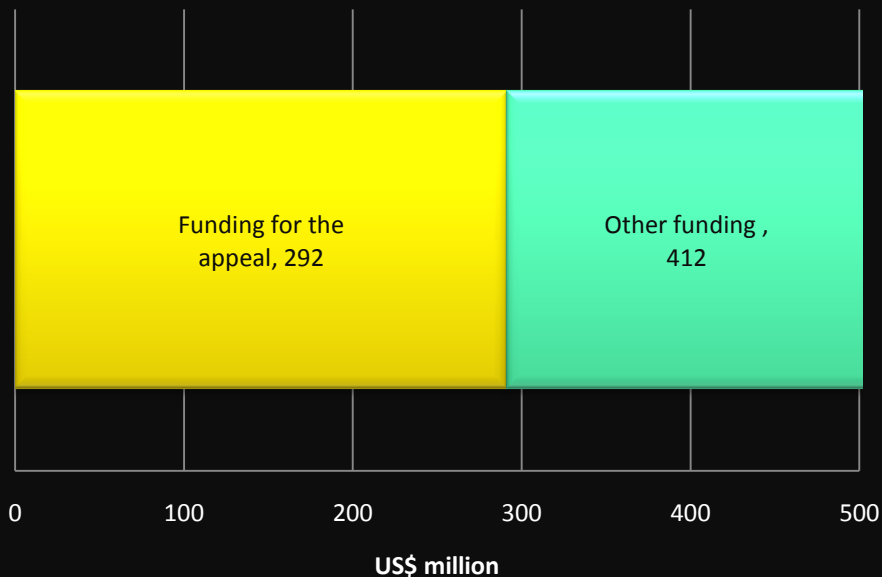


# Pakistan floods: 1 September 2010

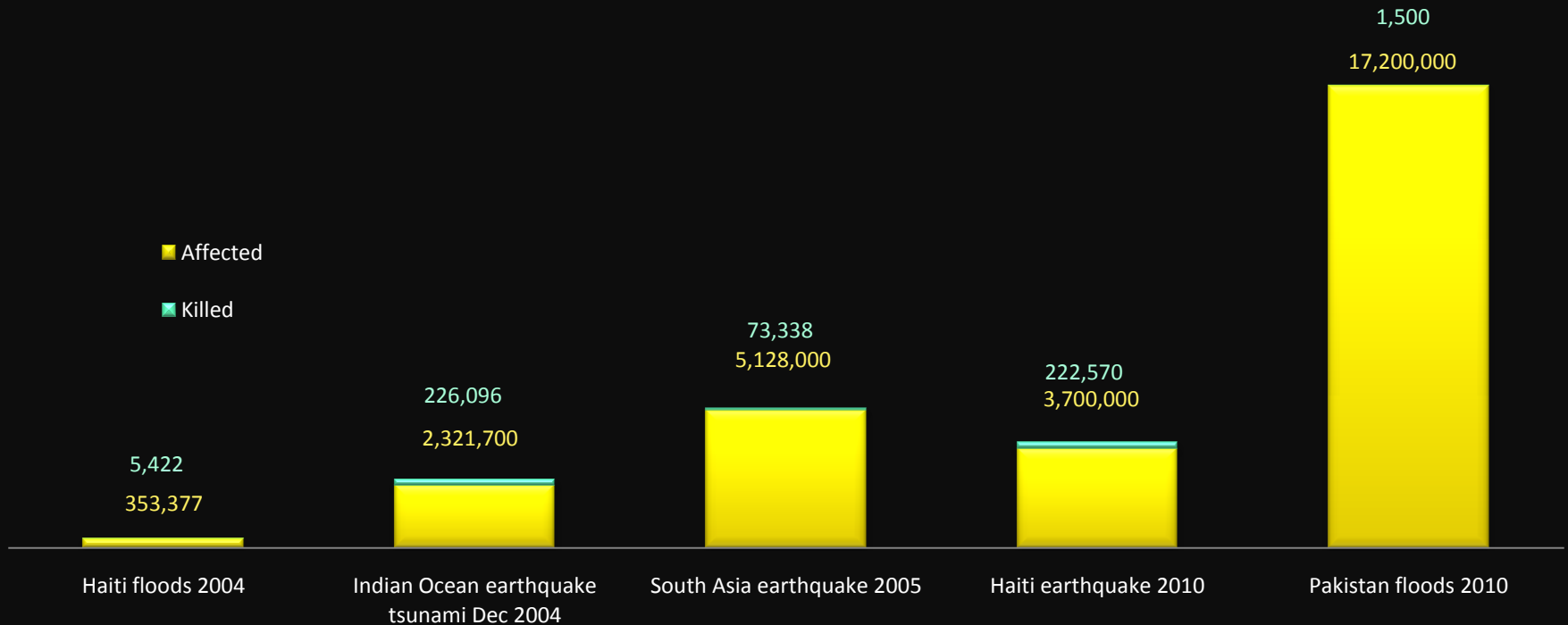
**Total funding for the emergency: US\$703.8m**



In August 2010 the United Nations launched an appeal (“Pakistan Initial Floods Emergency Response Plan 2010”) in response to the floods in Pakistan with an original request for US\$459 million. At the time of writing, US\$292 million has been committed directly to the appeal with an additional US\$412 million raised for the emergency. A number of donors have also volunteered pledges and in-kind contributions.

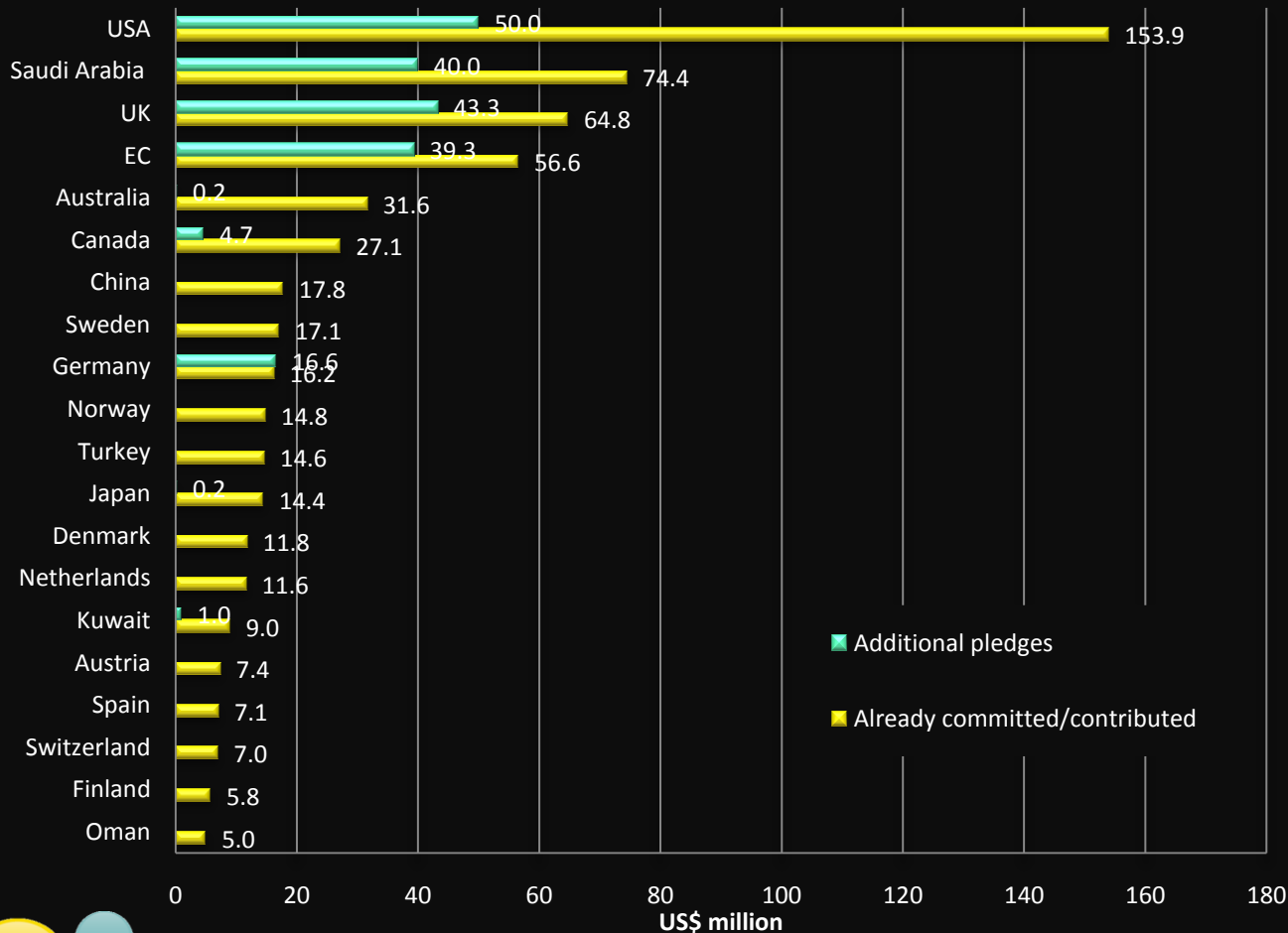
# Number of people killed and affected

## 20 largest contributors

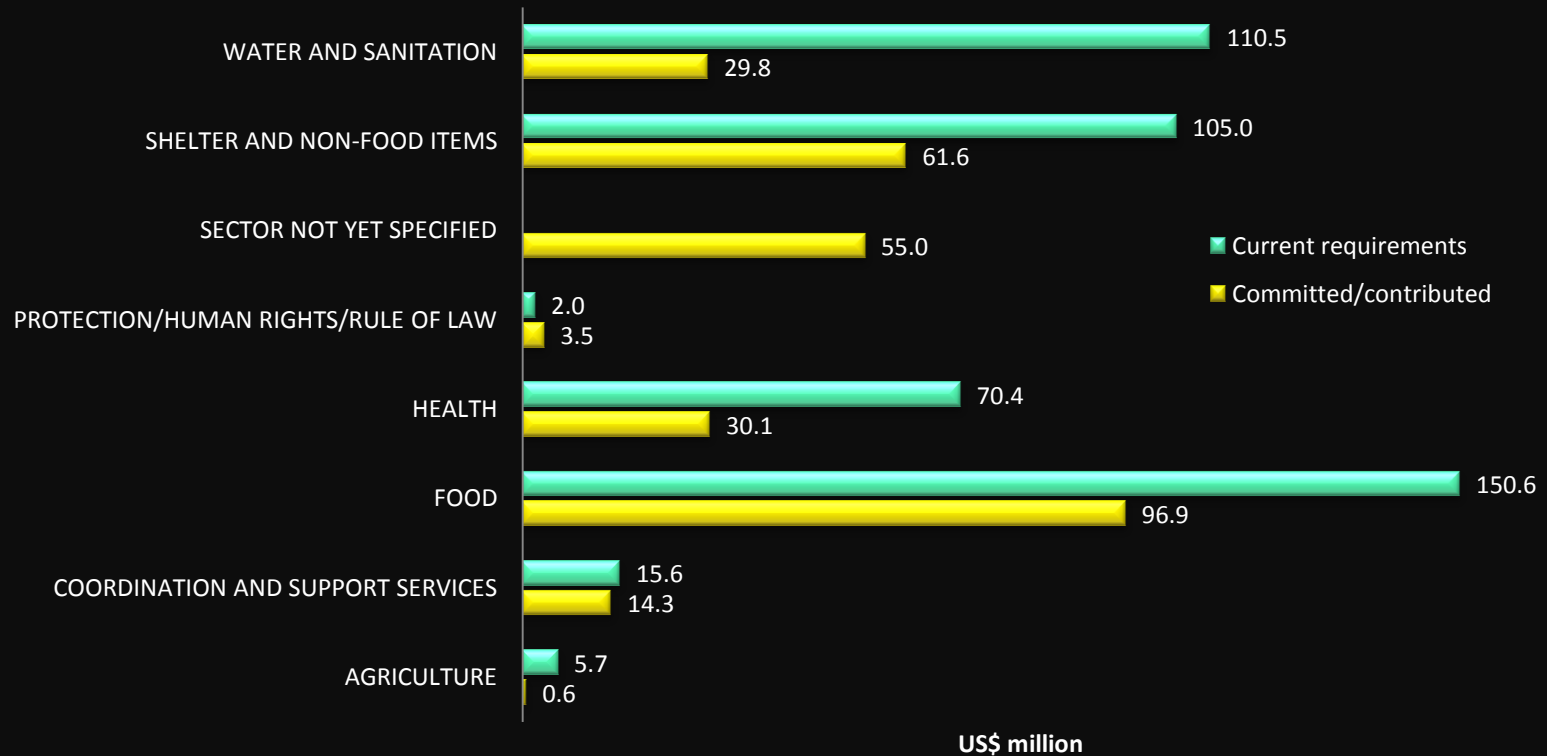


According to UN OCHA Financial Tracking Service (FTS), the European Commission and 60 governments have either pledged or contributed funding in response to the Pakistan earthquake. Actual contributions amount to US\$601.7 million, US\$251.5 million of which has been provided in support of the UN appeal.

A further US\$211.4 million has been pledged, US\$20.8 million of which in support of the UN appeal.

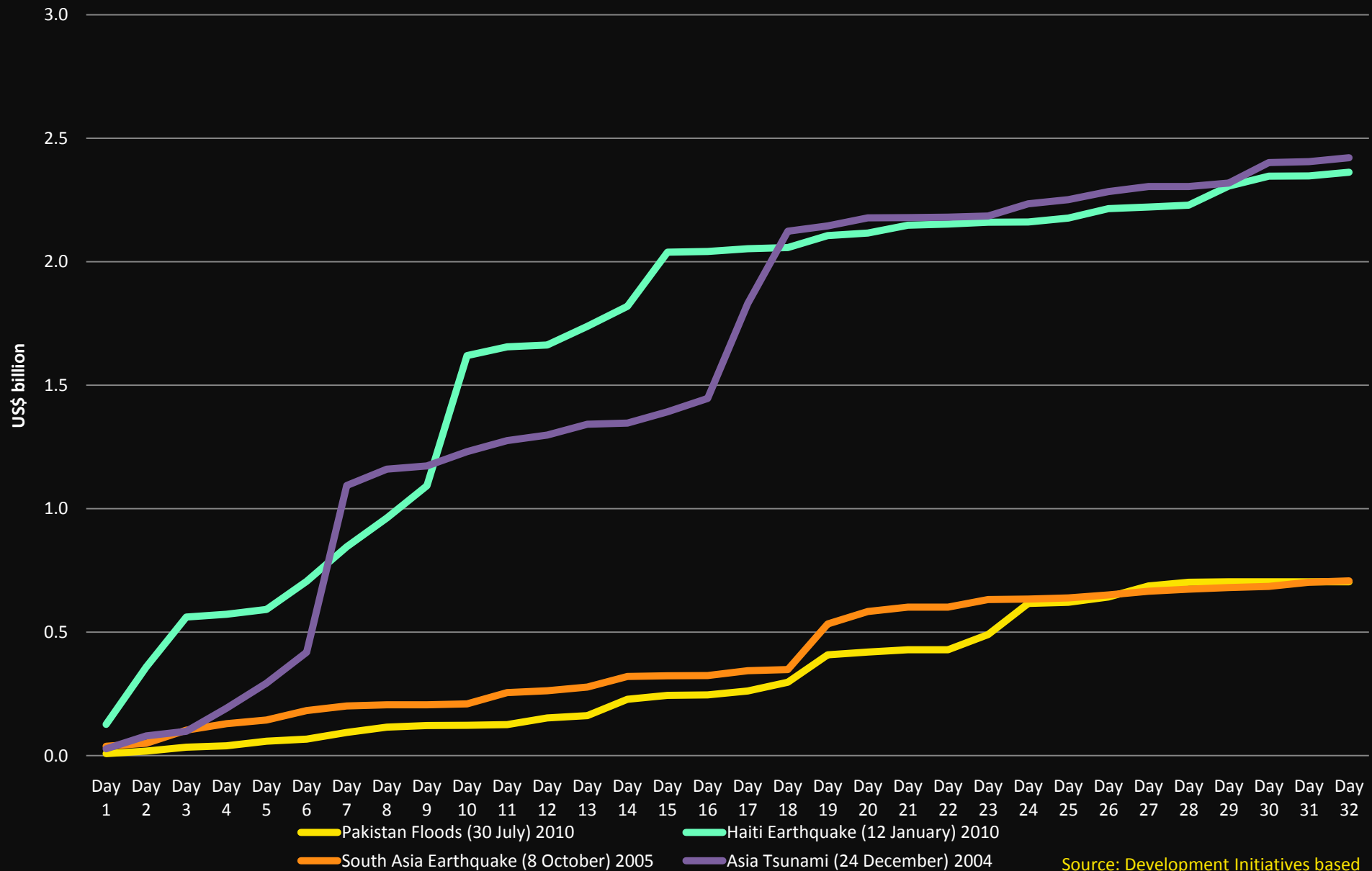
